St Aloysius' Feast Day: This Friday (21st June) is our parish feast day.

Our patron saint rose from a princely family. His father wanted him to be a military hero. He had a deep spiritual experience at age 7. At 9, he arrived at Florence to be educated. At 11, he was already teaching poor children catechism. Also, he fasted three days a week and practised much penance. At 13, he travelled with his parents and the empress of Austria to Spain, acting as a page in Philip II's court. He sought relief from court life the more he learned from it.

After reading a book on what Jesuit missionaries went through in India, he wanted to become a Jesuit. For four years, he had to contest this with his father. Eventually, he won and renounced his right to succession, then entered the Jesuit novitiate.

The Jesuits opened a hospital when a plague struck Rome in 1591. St Aloysius caught the disease as he was one of those nursing patients, washing them and making their beds. He recovered, but a fever persisted. He was so weak that he could scarcely rise from his bed. He died within the octave of Corpus Christi, aged 23.

Let us pray that our love for God may be more evident in how we love our neighbor. May our parish grow in quality and quantity. <u>Please join us for the 9 A. M Mass this Friday.</u>
